## **Chas Barnard**

Cellist Chas Barnard is an active performer, music educator and arts administrator based in Boulder, Colorado. As a member of the newly-formed Lírios Quartet, Barnard is pursuing an Artist Diploma in string quartet performance at CU Boulder, where he studies with Associate Professor David Requiro and members of the Takács Quartet. In the summers of 2019-2021, Barnard was a fellow at the Music Academy of the West where he won the London Symphony—Keston Max Audition and performed as a finalist of the Duo Competition. He returned to Music Academy in 2022 as chamber music specialist, overseeing the festival's chamber music program. Barnard is a founding member of the Sohap Ensemble, a soprano-cello duet with his wife, soprano Sabina Balsamo, which collaborates with artists and composers on commissions, recordings, and intimate, out-of-the-box musical experiences. Barnard enjoys spending time with his wife Sabina and his dog Jimmy, watching The Metropolitan Opera on-demand and taking in the natural beauty of Colorado.

## **Nicole Chung**

Nicole Chung was born in Seoul, Korea and began playing the cello at age 7. She is currently pursuing an Artist Diploma at University of Colorado Boulder, studying with Associate Professor David Requiro and serves as a graduate teaching assistant. In 2021, she received a master degree from Eastman School of Music where she worked with Steven Doane and Rosemary Elliott and served as a teaching assistant for Guy Johnston. In 2019, she graduated with a bachelor's degree from University of Michigan where she studied with Richard Aaron. Prior to her college years, she worked closely with Judith Fraser at the Vancouver Academy of Music in Canada.

## **Peyton Hall Magalhaes**

Brazilian-American cellist Peyton Hall Magalhaes has a rich cultural heritage in many different musical genres. From baroque to bossa nova, there are few styles he is not willing to try. Born in Lithuania, Magalhaes started his pursuits in cello at the age of six. This soon led him to the National M. K Čiurlionis School of Performing Arts where he continued his studies through high school in the capital city, Vilnius. After graduating, he was offered a full tuition scholarship to the Robert McDuffie Center for Strings in Macon, Georgia. There he studied with professors Julie Albers, Richard Aaron and Hans Jorgen-Jensen. Currently, Magalhaes is pursuing a master's degree in cello performance at the University of Colorado Boulder with Associate Professor David Requiro and serves as one of his graduate teaching assistants. Outside of the practice room, Magalhaes enjoys climbing and longboarding.

## **Vincent Ramirez-Boyce**

Vincent Ramirez-Boyce is both an active performer and teacher in the Denver area. The Dallas, Texas native holds degrees from DePaul University's School of Music and the University of Denver's Lamont School of Music, respectively, as well as a certificate in Suzuki Pedagogy from the University of Denver. Currently, Ramirez-Boyce is currently pursuing an Artist Diploma degree at the University of Colorado Boulder under the tutelage of Associate Professor David Requiro. Ramirez-Boyce participated in various summer festivals such as Green Mountain, Roundtop, Miami Summer Music Festival and The Apple Hill center for Chamber Music. He has also had the privilege of participating in masterclasses with Astrid Schween, Lawrence Dutton, Brant Taylor, Frank Huang and the Cavani String Quartet. In his free time, Ramirez-Boyce enjoys hiking and running.

## **Sophie Stubbs**

Sophie Stubbs is currently pursuing a Master of Music degree in cello pedagogy and performance at CU Boulder where she studies with Associate Professor David Requiro.

## **Matthew Wiest**

Matthew Wiest, 21, currently studies with Associate Professor David Requiro at the University of Colorado Boulder. In 2022, he finished runner-up in the CU Boulder Honors Competition, and has received several scholarship awards including the Colorado ASTA Summer Scholarship, the Sher Music Scholarship and the Stormo Music Endowment. Wiest has been selected to perform in masterclasses under the Calidore String Quartet, the Borromeo String Quartet, the Takacs Quartet, Lynn Harrell and Robert deMaine.
