About the choreographer: Devin has struggled with social anxiety for most of her life and has dealt with many moments of feeling out of place and unwanted. Her piece surrounds the ambivalence of her social reputation as she inconsistently switches from feeling social and appreciated to small and introverted. The internal rush of serotonin and frustration and inspired her to make a piece based on the internal representation of uncertainty and distraughtness demonstrated through accented movements, isolation, and togetherness. Maya wanted to say a special thanks to her collaborative partner Cassy for helping her through this creative process, choreographic blocks and for having another tall person to dance with, helping to release their social anxiety!


