## Directors' note

This immersive, haunted, Shakespearean experience is an idea that started back in 2014. Kevin Rich was working for the Illinois Shakespeare Festival at the time, a summer festival similar to our Colorado Shakespeare Festival, and was looking for events to produce during the school year. He had recently seen Punchdrunk's *Sleep No More*, an immersive riff on *Macbeth* in New York, and had the thought to produce a Shakespearean haunted attraction for Halloween. He contacted Andy Park, who at the time was artistic director of Quest Theatre Ensemble, well known in Chicago for creating magical spectacles. *ShakesFear* sold out in its first year, and became an annual tradition for the Illinois Shakespeare Festival.

Fast forward to 2021; Park is now artistic director at the Nebraska Repertory Theatre, and he and Rich remounted *ShakesFear* in Lincoln, Nebraska—this time, as an indoor haunted attraction and collaborating with talented puppet designer Jill Hibbard. This year, Rich, Park and Hibbard are bringing *ShakesFear* to CU Boulder, adapting it for the Mary Rippon Outdoor Theatre with an additional co-director: professional actor and director Heather Kelley, who is pursuing a PhD at CU Boulder with a dissertation focus on ghost stories. This is our 2022-23 Roe Green production, and Park and Hibbard are our Roe Green Visiting Artists, made possible by the generous support of donor Roe Green.

The plot lines of Shakespeare's plays were rarely original; most of the time, he adapted novels, extant plays and historical narratives for his contemporary audience. We present *ShakesFear* in that spirit, adapting Shakespeare's texts to provide a new, fresh look at his characters in a contemporary context. We hope those of you new to Shakespeare will get a thrilling introduction to his plays, that Shakespeare fans will have fun spotting Easter eggs (or should we call them *Halloween* eggs?) and that you all enjoy this immersive, Shakespearean experience!

With a BA in theatre and communications from the University of Colorado Boulder and a MA in theatre from Kent State University, her experience in stage and business management includes Porthouse Theatre, Cain Park, Cleveland Opera and Cincinnati Playhouse in the Park. Today, she is President Emeritus of C.A.V.O.R.T. Inc. (Conference About Volunteers of Regional Theatre), serves on the Foundation board of Kent State University, the Board of the Cleveland Play House (where she is Honorary Producer of New Ground and the board of Maltz Jupiter Theatre in Florida). She also created the Green House, a

battered women's shelter in Geauga, Ohio. Green is an avid traveler, having visited over 160 countries and sees theatre whenever she can. Green received the Governor's 2009 Ohio Arts Council's Governor's Arts Patron Award, the 2012 Alumni Recognition Award from CU Boulder, the 2013 Dramatist Guild Fund Award and the Muse Award (2014) from the Cultural Council of Palm Beach.

In 2015, Green received the Kent State University College of the Arts' inaugural Centennial Award for her service and patronage, and the Cleveland Play House Super Nova Award. In 2017, she received the Theatre Forward Leadership Award at the Theatre Forward Chairman's Awards Gala, the 2018 Lifetime Achievement Award, and in 2020 was named a winner of the Cleveland Arts Prize.

Her gifts to CU Boulder have created the Roe Green Visiting Theatre Artist Program and the Roe Green Endowed Chair in Theatre. We all thank Roe Green (BA Theatre '70) for her munificent support of our department.


