Jack and Algernon invent alter egos to escape their tiresome lives. But when they try to win the hearts of Gwendolen and Cecily, they become tangled in deception, disguise, and misadventure.

Oscar Wilde originally wrote this play as a satire on the social obligations of Victorian England.

Director's Note

The Importance of Being Earnest premiered in London in 1895, when playwright Oscar Wilde was at the height of his renowned fame and success. That same year, the British legal system would sentence him to the maximum penalty of two years' hard labor because of his sexual orientation.

CU Boulder's Old Main building, where this work is being produced, was built in 1876, around 20 years before *Earnest* premiered. It should be noted, however, that the Chapel Theatre in which you're sitting is not as it originally appeared. The design of this theatre was the result of a renovation under the guidance of theatre professor Richard Knaub in 1982. This created a new 224-seat performance theatre / lecture hall within the rehabilitated and reconstructed original theatre, to include a new proscenium, extensive historic millwork and ornamentation, a trompe l'oeil painted ceiling and technical theatre systems.

During the current itinerant year, when our department's major theatres are undergoing desperately needed renovations, we are grateful to partner with the College of Arts & Sciences and return to this jewel-box theatre in Old Main.

Oscar Wilde's life continues to resonate with theatregoers and theatre makers alike through biographical films and plays such as *Gross Indecency: The Three*

Trials of Oscar Wilde, which Colorado's own BETC produced in partnership with the Department of Theatre & Dance in 2012.

In his last play, Oscar Wilde shows us that what society deemed polite behavior was a lie that came from a warped social structure. Wilde employs near-malapropisms and uses language in an almost surrealist way. Had his career not been cut short, it's interesting to imagine what kind of writing Wilde would have done, as he was on the precipice of surrealism and the Dada movement of the 1920s and 30s.

We hope that Wilde would support our fresh interpretation of this classic comedy that has never gone out of fashion.


