DRAMATURG'S NOTE

The prime association with vampires is blood. Blood is not just a preoccupation of those who feed on it, however. In an early production meeting, fight director Sean Scrutchins excellently summarized this point with the statement, "We all bleed." Whether the blood is human or supernatural, a physical or metaphorical wound, anyone who has lived enough time on Earth has experienced the turmoil and sacrifice blood often represents.

One of the main patterns noticed by both actors and production team members about the play was the cycle of trauma and violence characters inflict on each other. Some commit these violent acts intentionally, others inadvertently. No matter how the violence was intended, we can see how the internal and external wounds received mark and influence the arcs of each character throughout the story.

Blood is not always a bad thing though. It is just as often a symbol of life, love, and connection. While Oskar and Eli receive and inflict many horrors over the course of the play, their dedication to each other is as deep and fierce as any real-life time where you meet the rare person that just gets you. Just as blood transcends the notion of "good" or "evil," so do the characters of Let the Right One In. Everyone has the capacity for empathy and apathy, for pleasure and pain.

Originally written in novel-form by John Ajvide Lindqvist in 2004, *Let the Right One In* is the end result of a book turned into a film turned into a play; a nesting doll of adaptation. Yet, the through-line of the passion and sacrifice involved in life and undeath illuminates clearly from page to stage with Jack Thorne's script. This leaves the audience with much food for thought—whether that food is blood or otherwise.
