PROGRAM NOTES

Synopsis and Playwright's Note

The Olive Tree is a story about inheritance—of trauma, of power, of memory—and the courage it takes to rewrite what we've been told is unchangeable.

When we began this journey, I kept returning to the image of a seed buried beneath scorched earth. Even after fire, even after centuries of being trampled or forgotten, it waits—quietly, stubbornly—for the right conditions to grow. This play is that seed. It asks: What do we do with the stories we inherit? The ones that were twisted, buried, or stolen? And how do we turn the ashes of empire into something living again?

Here, myth and memory coexist. The Storybook isn't just a magical object—it's a metaphor for history itself: who gets to write it, who gets erased and who has the power to restore what was lost. It also honors the traditions of storytelling that predate the written word—the songs, the spoken lineages, the histories passed down through those who did not possess the privilege to control the narrative in books. *The Olive Tree* celebrates those voices—the keepers of oral history—whose truths have survived through rhythm, through voice, through story.

At the heart of this piece is live-looping—a sonic metaphor for cycles of trauma, repetition and repair. Each loop represents the patterns we inherit, the ones we are called to disrupt. It's also a testament to the power of the individual artist who dares to wield that technology—to break a cycle, to build something new and to transform isolation into harmony.

This production asks for an ensemble that breathes as one organism—looping, harmonizing, moving together. We are not building a hierarchy; we are building a collective. Each voice, body, and sound is a vital branch in the growing tree of this piece.

May *The Olive Tree* remind us that stories, like roots, reach deeper than borders or time.

May it honor those who came before, and those who continue to fight for the right to exist, to create, and to be remembered.



ROE GREEN

Roe Green, arts patron and community activist, is chief executive officer of the Roe Green Foundation. With a BA in theatre and communications from the University of Colorado Boulder and a MA in theatre from Kent State University, her experience in stage and business management includes Porthouse Theatre, Cain Park, Cleveland Opera and Cincinnati Playhouse in the Park.

Today, she is President Emeritus of C.A.V.O.R.T. Inc. (Conference About Volunteers of Regional Theatre), serves on the foundation board of Kent State University, the board of the Cleveland Play House (where she is Honorary Producer of New Ground) and the board of Maltz Jupiter Theatre in Florida. She also created the Green House, a battered women's shelter in Geauga, Ohio.

Green is an avid traveler, having visited more than 160 countries, and sees theatre whenever she can. She received the Governor's

2009 Ohio Arts Council's Governor's Arts Patron Award, the 2012 Alumni Recognition Award from CU Boulder, the 2013 Dramatist Guild Fund Award and the Muse Award (2014) from the Cultural Council of Palm Beach.

In 2015, Green received the Kent State University College of the Arts' inaugural Centennial Award for her service and patronage, and the Cleveland Play House Super Nova Award. In 2017, she received the Theatre Forward Leadership Award at the Theatre Forward Chairman's Awards Gala, the 2018 Lifetime Achievement Award, and in 2020 was named a winner of the Cleveland Arts Prize. In 2023, Green received an honorary Doctor of Humane Letters from Kent State University.

Her gifts to CU Boulder have created the Roe Green Visiting Theatre Artist Program and the Roe Green Endowed Chair in Theatre. We all thank Roe Green (BA Theatre '70) for her munificent support of our department.
