Biographies

Clare Berndt

Clare Berndt is pursuing her master's degree in music education at the University of Colorado Boulder, where she is the assistant conductor of the Men's Chorus. After receiving her undergraduate degree from the University of Wisconsin La Crosse, Berndt worked for six years as a sixth through eighth grade choral and general music teacher in Wisconsin. As a performer, Berndt has sung with the Madison and Milwaukee Symphony Choirs.

Emilie Bertram

Emilie Bertram is a second year DMA student in Choral Conducting at University of Colorado, Boulder, and is a co-conductor of CU Women's Chorus. Prior to beginning her doctoral studies, Bertram taught in the public and private school systems in Minnesota, New York and California for 10 years, instructing general, piano, vocal, and choral music for students in grade kindergarten through the collegiate level. While living in California, Bertram taught at Presentation High School in San Jose, where she conducted the Bella Voce Women's Chorus. Under Bertram's guidance, Bella Voce was invited to perform in San Francisco. Anaheim, Seattle, Vancouver, Ireland and New York City, and was a featured ensemble at the 2017 CA ACDA (American Choral Directors Association) State Convention. Bertram holds a BM degree specializing in Secondary Vocal Music Education and Piano from Concordia College in Moorhead, MN, where she studied under Dr. Reneé Clausen. and received a MM degree from the Ithaca College School of Music in Ithaca, NY, where she worked with Dr. Janet Galvan. She has sung as a soprano II with the Valley Concert Chorale, The Choral Project, Peninsula Cantare and currently with the CU Boulder University Singers. Bertram resides in CO with her husband and twin boys.

Corie Brown

Conductor-teacher and contralto Corie Brown earned her master's in choral conducting at the University of Oregon, and is in her final semester of her doctorate at CU Boulder. Brown brings over eleven years of diverse experience to the podium, having taught with the national music organization Batuta (Colombia) and in the public schools of Chicago and Michigan. She recently performed with the Oregon Bach Festival, Ad Astra Music Festival (KS) and at Carnegie Hall under Andrea Ramsey, and was a semi-finalist of the NW ACDA Conducting Competition. Current research interests include how to better serve marginalized populations in the choral rehearsal and tools for collaboration between wind and choral conductors. Brown's enthusiasm and empowering pedagogy compliments the CU Women's Chorus, with whom she is honored to share the stage.

Aaron Harp

Aaron Harp is in his second year of doctoral studies at the University of Colorado Boulder and serves as the conductor of Collegiate Chorale and assistant conductor of University Choir. Prior to beginning his degree, he taught high school and middle school choir in Texas for five years. He holds a Master of Music degree from the University of North Texas in vocal performance and conducting and a Bachelor of Music degree from Ouachita Baptist University in vocal performance. Harp is in frequent demand as a soloist and chorister. He has performed with many noted ensembles, including Santa Fe Desert Chorale, Colorado Bach Ensemble, Bach Society Houston, Dallas Bach Society, and Anima Chamber Ensemble.

Daniel Parks

Daniel Parks is a first-year doctoral student in choral conducting at the University of Colorado Boulder and assistant conductor of the Collegiate Chorale. He completed a Master of Music degree in Choral Conducting at the University of Minnesota Twin Cities and a Bachelor of Music degree in Music Education at Lawrence University. As an educator, Parks taught choral music, voice, and music theater at the middle and high school levels for five years in Wisconsin. He has performed with the Minnesota Chorale, Weimar Bach Cantata Academy, Border CrosSing, PopUp

Choir and NewVoices Choir. His research interests include vocal improvisation and early music.

Craig Robertson

Craig L. Robertson has been a successful music educator for over 13 years and his choral ensembles have won several regional and national awards. He holds a Bachelor of Music Education degree from Virginia State University and a Master of Music Education degree from Georgia State University. He is currently pursuing the DMA in choral conducting and literature, where he is the conductor of CU Men's Chorus and assistant conductor of University Singers. He has also conducted the University Choir, Festival Singers and Summer Lab Choir. He is the current director of music for Children and Youth Choirs at the historic Montview Presbyterian Church, where he conducts children choirs and youth handbells.

Jordan Hugh Sam

Jordan Hugh Sam directs the Madrigal Ensemble and vocal portion of the Early Music Ensemble at CU. Previously, he was employed as the assistant choral director at Amherst College, where he directed groups and taught aural skills and music appreciation. In addition to his interest in choral conducting, Sam has worked as collaborative pianist at University of Massachusetts and Amherst College. He maintains an active research interest in the intersection of queer identity and early music, and recently presented his work at the Society for Seventeenth-Century Music and the North Carolina Colloquium in Medieval and Early Modern Studies. Sam received his BA in Music from Amherst College, finished his MM in choral conducting at the University of Colorado Boulder, and will begin a PhD in Historical Musicology at UCI A in Fall 2019.

Brian Stone

After four years teaching high school, most recently at Denver East High School, Brian Stone has returned to CU to pursue a DMA in choral conducting and literature. At CU, Stone has led the

Collegiate Chorale, University Singers and directs the vocal jazz ensembles. As a conductor outside of CU, Stone serves as music director of Cantabile Singers, a community ensemble in Boulder, and as choir director at First Unitarian Society of Denver. As a professional singer on the front range, Stone has performed with St. Martin's Chamber Choir, Anima Chamber Ensemble, the Evans Choir and Voices of Light. Stone received his BM in voice performance from the University of Puget Sound and his MM in choral conducting from the University of Colorado Boulder.

Elizabeth Swanson

Elizabeth Swanson is the associate director of choral studies at the University of Colorado Boulder. Swanson conducts the University Choir and teaches undergraduate courses in choral conducting and applied lessons in conducting at the graduate level. This academic year, she is serving as the interim director of choral studies and conductor of the University Singers as Gregory Gentry, the director of choral studies, has taken a sabbatical leave. Prior to her appointment at CU Boulder. Swanson was the director of choirs at Nyack College in New York City. Under her direction, the Nyack College Chorale performed concerts in renowned venues such as David Geffen Hall at Lincoln Center, the Cathedral of St. John the Divine and St. Paul's Chapel at Trinity Church Wall Street, and toured domestically. Swanson has also been the conductor of choral ensembles at the University of Chicago and North Park University, Roosevelt University (Chicago College of Performing Arts), and Ithaca College. Swanson is an active quest conductor, a presenter at regional and national conferences and has been published in the Choral Journal. She has served on the National Board of the National Collegiate Choral Organization (NCCO). Swanson earned degrees from Northwestern University (DM Conducting), Ithaca College (MM Conducting) and St. Olaf College (BM Vocal Education).
