Kpatsa

Kpatsa is a dance of the Ga-Adangme people in Southern Ghana. Mythology says that Ga-Adangme hunters first learned it from the dwarfs. In modern society, it is performed at many different types of gathering, including those of leaders, visits by important figures and holiday celebrations.

Highlife
