The University of Colorado Boulder's annual High School Madrigal Festival is one of the oldest ongoing musical events at CU. Founded in 1961 by Charles Byers, at the suggestion of Dean Warner Imig, the festival promoted the establishment of madrigal and chamber choirs in high schools throughout the state of Colorado. Today, over 500 high school choristers and their directors spend a full day in historic Macky Auditorium working with a nationally recognized clinician, sharing repertoire, performing and participating in various workshops. 

Personnel



Richard Bjella has distinguished himself as a conductor, clinician, choral pedagogue and choral arranger. In 2014, Biella was appointed artistic director of the San Antonio Chamber Choir. Their most recent CD, UNFROZEN: A Baltic Christmas received Grammy attention in 2018. He recently retired from Texas Tech University, but previous to his work in Lubbock, Bjella served 25 years as director of choral studies at the Lawrence Conservatory of Music, leading the Concert Choir in an acclaimed performance at the 2009 National ACDA Convention. The Texas Tech University Choir has been celebrated for its excellence in Carnegie Hall, Orchestra Hall, at TMEA convention appearances and at the 2013 ACDA Convention. Bjella has presented workshops at several ACDA national and regional conventions and has been a headliner for countless events from Alaska to Florida for teachers and students alike. It has also been his honor to conduct and present masterclasses around the world and at over 400 festivals and workshops in 33 states. including several appearances at Lincoln Center, Orchestra Hall, and Carnegie Hall. He has also presented workshops and conducted in South Korea, England, France, Switzerland, Lithuania, Columbia, Haiti, Estonia and Italy. This year, he is conducting and leading workshops at 10 universities from Colorado to Florida, doing countless festivals with high school students and will be the choral editor for the San Antonio Chamber Choir Choral Series with Hal Leonard beginning in 2021. He is also active in the promotion of creative choral programming and is a contributing writer for The Oxford Handbook of Choral Pedagogy (2017) with his chapter, The Art of Successful Programming: Study, Selection and Synthesis. Bjella was recipient of a 2017 Professing Excellence Award at Texas Tech University and the Lawrence University teaching award in 2008. This award is given to outstanding faculty who go "above and beyond," both inside and outside the classroom, to impact student learning and academic success. He was also honored to receive the Lawrence Award for Teaching Excellence in 2008 and the Morris Hayes Lifetime Achievement Award from the Wisconsin Choral Directors.

Elizabeth Swanson is the associate director of choral studies at the University of Colorado Boulder. She is honored to serve as the conductor of the University Choir, which was founded in 1938 by Warner Imig. A passionate educator, Swanson also teaches courses in conducting at the undergraduate level and applied lessons in conducting at the graduate

level and serves on master's and doctoral committees. Swanson maintains an active schedule as a guest conductor, clinician and adjudicator throughout the United States. Her conducting students have reached the final round in ACDA student conducting competitions and have been hired by leading universities upon graduation. Additionally, Swanson serves on the executive board of the National Collegiate Choral Organization as acting chief editor of publications. In this capacity, she edits NCCO's peer-reviewed journal, The Choral Scholar, and curates NCCO's highly selective choral music publication, the NCCO Choral Series, which is distributed by the ECS Publishing Group. Prior to her appointment at CU Boulder, Swanson lived in New York City, where she was director of choirs at Nyack College School of Music in lower Manhattan and an arts administrator with Manhattan Concert Productions. Previously, Swanson has been a member of the conducting faculty at the University of Chicago, North Park University and Ithaca College and has served as a conductor of choral ensembles at Northwestern University and Roosevelt University (Chicago College of Performing Arts). Swanson earned degrees from Northwestern University (DM Conducting), Ithaca College (MM Conducting) and St. Olaf College (BM Vocal Education).

Pianist Hsiao-Ling Lin joined the keyboard department faculty at the University of Colorado Boulder in the fall of 2011. Her active performing career has taken her to Carnegie Hall's Weill Recital Hall, Isabella Stewart Garden Museum and Jordan Hall in Boston, the Chicago Symphony Hall and Chicago Cultural Center, Sendai Cultural Center in Japan and the Rachmaninoff Hall in Russia. Since coming to the United States from Taiwan, Lin's performances have been broadcasted live over television and radio stations. She has

collaborated in recitals with many renowned artists, ranging from violinists and cellists to flutists, oboists and clarinetists and with members of the Takács and Tokyo quartets. members of the Boston, Chicago, Cincinnati, Colorado and St. Louis symphony orchestras and the Los Angeles Philharmonic. Recently, she completed a tour of recitals in Asia and Europe with trombonist Peter Steiner. Lin has held staff pianist positions at Musicorda in Massachusetts, the International Festival Institute at Round Top, Summer Music Festival at Walnut Hill, the Boston Conservatory, the Chicago College of Performing Arts at Roosevelt University, Northwestern University and the Meadowmount School for Strings in New York. Interested in promoting music of diversity and multiculturalism, Lin was appointed as the resident pianist for the touring chamber music-theater company Core Ensemble from 2009 to 2012. She performs regularly with the Colorado Symphony and the local chamber series with members of Colorado Symphony. Beginning in spring 2016, she became rehearsal pianist for the Colorado Symphony Chorus. Live performances can be heard on KVOD, KCFP and KCFR radio. Lin earned her Doctor of Musical Art degree in piano performance and collaborative arts from Northwestern University under the guidance of James Giles and Elizabeth Buccheri and holds degrees from the New England Conservatory and DePaul University.
