# Dramaturg's Notes

The stunningly haunting imageries throughout the play *We Are the Wake* by Ayla Sullivan observes New York's Hart Island: a mass-burial ground situated in the State of New York. Sullivan offers a theatrical space to celebrate minority identities, the people of color, the queers, the incarcerated, the immigrants, and the undocumented bodies, at once capturing the ethical dilemmas and earnest journeys of the characters as the play progresses. The concept of this play is of great relevance considering both the social and political unrest and the worldwide identity crisis we are currently experiencing.

As a dramaturg, for me, the most fascinating as well as challenging aspect was to understand human existence at large. How do we survive as a human community? Is the experience of death strong enough to unite us: people from diverse racial-ethnic-social-economic background? Are we witnessing life through the eyes of the deceased? These are some questions that motivated me to move forward with this play knowing that there are no ideal answers to the questions.

Most of the characters in this play are inspired by real life characters. Although the play is not entirely autobiographical, some of the characters and incidents appear to emerge from the playwright's own life. My job was to ensure that we are representing and establishing the real-life characters on stage sensibly and authentically. In this play, as I perceive, the burial ground comes alive. It's a character in itself.

Throughout the play, along with all the characters, the burial ground experiences the exclusion and violence. The unclaimed bodies take refuge in the ground and the burial ground protects them like a mother. This imagery of the earth protecting the marginalized, the unclaimed, and the unwanted become poignant with regard to the concept of the play. It is my hope that *We Are the Wake* generates love and support despite all the oppositions and complications in the world.
