PROGRAM NOTES

Symphony No. 8, Op. 88

Antonín Dvořák (1841-1904)

The finale of Dvořák's Symphony No. 8 bursts forth with jubilant energy and unmistakable Bohemian spirit. Cast in the form of a theme and variations, the movement opens with a bold trumpet fanfare, heralding the triumphant entry of a noble main theme in the cellos. This melody, both lyrical and rustic, serves as the backbone for a kaleidoscope of transformations that follow—from pastoral serenity to fiery exuberance.

Dvořák's mastery of orchestral color is on full display here: bright woodwind interjections evoke the sounds of a countryside celebration, while the strings and brass trade rhythms that recall the liveliness of Czech folk dances. A slower, almost wistful episode interrupts the jubilant flow before the music builds again, layer by layer, into a thrilling conclusion of radiant grandeur. Unlike the stormy finales of many romantic symphonies, Dvořák's conclusion is joyous, earthy and deeply human—a celebration of life and nature rather than struggle and tragedy. The movement's closing pages sweep listeners along in a blaze of brass and timpani, affirming the composer's gift for combining folk vitality with symphonic brilliance.

Red Rocks Fanfare (2009)

John Bogenschutz (b. 1977)

Red Rocks Fanfare is named after the Red Rocks Amphitheater located in Morrison, Colorado, right outside the Denver city limits. While there are numerous different red rocks in the state park, the two bigger rocks impressively stand out from the rest: the Creation Rock and Ship Rock. These are the two rocks that sit on either side of the stands where people are seated to watch and listen to concerts. While the rocks do look great in the winter with snow on top of them, I especially like the way they look during the summer against the bright green hillside landscape.

Breath of the Mountains (2023)

Cait Nishimura (b. 1991)

Breath of the Mountains was commissioned by Sam Yamamoto and the Lethbridge Collegiate Institute Gold Symphonic Band. Lethbridge is located in Southern Alberta, where the landscape and climate are shaped by powerful warming winds called chinooks coming from the Canadian Rocky Mountains. In addition to these winds, Lethbridge is known for having more than 320 days of sunshine each year.

When writing this piece, I reflected on my time visiting Lethbridge in 2020 (my last pre-pandemic residency) where I had the opportunity to connect with the welcoming music community and also experience the warm sunshine and expansive, powerful winds that define this part of the province. I began thinking of the wind as a life force; an expression of aliveness coming from the mountains in the form of birdsong, flowing water, hills and valleys,

and sparkling sunlight. And as I wondered what that wind would sound like, *Breath of the Mountains* was born.

Brooklyn Air (2016)

Nicole Piunno (b. 1986)

In Brooklyn (and pretty much everywhere else in New York City), the air is always an exotic melting pot of smells. Freshly baked donuts, sweet springtime flowers and salty ocean breezes combine with car exhaust, dust and sun-baked garbage to form an aromatic paradox. Every breath you take is complex and bittersweet.

In Italian, the word for "air" is aria, a word most of us probably recognize from its origins in opera. Although we typically know it as being a song for solo voice, an aria could also be more simply described as any expressive melody. The word also literally translates to "expression" and "tune."

Brooklyn Air is a musical play on these words: a lyrical song flavored with extended jazz harmonies, grimy dissonances and sweet melodies. The piece opens with buzzing trombone glissandi complemented by a lulling ocean drum and the slow scraping of a brake drum that introduce our ears to a musty, somewhat industrial atmosphere. The woodwinds soon enter singing sweet and salty chords: major, minor, major, minor. By measure 17, the ensemble has landed on a succulent B-flat major chord, our most pleasant taste yet, but by measure 18, the saltiness returns to our palette—a concert E-natural, the raised fourth scale degree, sings sharply in the melody.

Vesuvius (1999)

Frank Ticheli (b. 1958)

Mount Vesuvius, the volcano that destroyed Pompeii in AD 79, is an icon of power and energy in this work. Originally, I had in mind a wild and passionate dance such as might have been performed at an ancient Roman bacchanalia. During the compositional process, I began to envision something more explosive and fiery. With its driving rhythms, exotic modes, and quotations from the *Dies Irae* from the medieval *Requiem Mass*, it became evident that the bacchanalia I was writing could represent a dance from the final days of the doomed city of Pompeii.
